We staggered through to the end of the year with lessons delivered by e-mail (the dizzying heights of my technical ability at the time.)

For the first term of the new year, we managed classes with a limited number in-house with the rest able to follow on Zoom. Since January classes have been 100% on Zoom. This time last year I could barely spell Zoom and was violently opposed to it, declaring emphatically that it wouldn't suit me and wouldn't suit my classes.
